SBU-R WELCOMES STUDENTS BACK ON CAMPUS

A fter two years of online distance learning, San Beda University-Rizal finally opened its gates for face-to-face learning this academic year 2022-2023.

The school year first started off with the 4-1 modality, according to DepEd Order No. 44 s. 2022. In the case of SBU-R, the students only went to the school grounds on Wednesday for homeroom and school events, such as the ROARientation, Student Council Miting De Avance and Elections, and Social Action Program (SAP) activities.

However, last November 28 2022, the 3-2 Modality was implemented for the second quarter, in which students went on-campus for three days and attended online classes for two days every week.



In addition, San Beda University-Rizal also launched Academic Learning, Research, Wellness and Engagement (ALRWE) period, a 1-2 hour free period in the afternoon to help the students accomplish their tasks and to allot time for answering their queries regarding their respective subjects. With the help of the new ALRWE period and by following the strict campus health guidelines and protocols, it was guaranteed that learning will be fun and interactive on-campus once again.

The pandemic has truly been a roller coaster ride as it was unexpected and sudden. In just a blink of an eye, what used to be a fun learning session in the classroom turned into online distance learning where students can only interact with their teachers and classmates virtually, with the help of technological applications such Microsoft Teams Microsoft Outlook.

The 3-2 learning modality sparked a change as students adjusted from learning through online meetings to in-person ones.

This made learning more interactive, instead of raising your hand or using reactions in MS Teams, you can see the actual reaction of your classmates and teachers on site.

In those struggles, Bedans remained unfazed and positive as they started their full face-to-face learning on February 15, 2023.

GOVERNMENT REQUIRES ALL SIM USERS TO REGISTER IDENTITY FOR ACTIVATION

President Ferdinand "Bongbong" Marcos Jr. signed the Subscriber Identity Module (SIM) Card Registration Law or Republic Act (RA 11934) last October 2, 2022, which will require all SIM users to register their information to the government before their SIM can be activated.


The said law aims to reduce spam messages and fight text scams. It also seeks to make it easier for the police to track criminals, for perpetrators cannot remain anonymous under prepaid SIMs in burner phones anymore. In the implementation of RA 11934, all SIM users will be required to register their SIM cards with a Public Telecommunications Entity (PTE).

New SIM users must register, before the SIM can be activated. Meanwhile existing SIM users must register within 180 days of the law's implementation, or else their SIM will be automatically deactivated. Despite the Senate's written anti-cybercrime purposes behind the law, some people express data privacy concerns over the SIM Card Registration Law.

Former officer-in-charge of the National Privacy Commission's Privacy Policy Office Ivy Grace Villasoto raised that there may be "a heightened risk of the occurrence of personal data breaches and unauthorized processing of personal data".

Cybersecurity policy analyst Mary Grace Mirandilla-Santos strengthened this by citing histories of SIM registration security dangers from developing countries and the European Union.

In response to these concerns, President Marcos Jr. assured that "any registered information shall be treated as absolutely

PH GOVERNMENT LIMITS HEALTH WORKERS FROM LEAVING THE COUNTRY

The COVID-19 Pandemic profoundly affected the country, especially the hard-working health workers who are unfortunately underpaid in the Philippines.

According to Rappler, most health workers in the country are not only underpaid but also overworked. Not only this, but sometimes hospitals also delay their salaries for up to two months.

This has become the last straw for them, and the countries' health workers do not deserve this unjust treatment, so they try their luck to work abroad. But what happens when the government, instead of helping its citizens find new opportunities in other countries, limits them from leaving the country?

Based on an article by Philstar, the Department of Health (DOH) wants to keep the deployment cap among health workers due to the lack of health workers like dentists, nurses, pharmacists, and physicians in the country.

Last 2020, a deployment cap of 5,000 health workers was set, but this has been increased to 7,500 in 2022. The health officer-in-charge, Maria Rosario Vergeire, said that she hopes for the deployment cap to stay the same until the country produces more healthcare professionals.

However, many disagreed with Vergeire as the salary of local hospitals of 25,000 is not enough to sustain the family and pay the bills of the health workers. As reported by The Straits Times, President Ferdinand Marcos Jr. vows to increase the deployment cap of health workers.

The pandemic indeed has had a negative impact on hard-working Filipino workers, especially in the healthcare field. But until now, the government is still trying to figure out ways how to encourage Filipinos to keep working in the Philippines, even with the low local salary and the rapid increase of prices in the market.







There are wisps of distaste thrown about, fractures of portrayals where the generation is shown to be anything but models of ethereal nicety.



Kung aalalahanin, bigla-biglang pinagsusuntok ni Amores ang mga manlalaro ng College of Saint Benilde (CSB). Nabiktima ng kaniyang hindi mapigilang galit ang CSB Blazers na sila Mark Sangco, Migz Oczon, Jimboy Pasturan, at Taine Davis. Dalawa sa kanila ay sugatan ang mukha mula sa tama ng suntok ni Amores.

Kinalaunan, nagsampa sila Pasturan at Davis (CSB players) ng official injury complaint laban kay Amores matapos makapagtamo ng mga sugat sa panunugod nito.

Ang Blazers Head Coach na si Charles Tiu ang nagsilbing testigo sa reklamo ng kanyang mga manlalaro. Maliban dito, may iba pang kasong kinakaharap si Amores, kabilang dito ang criminal charge mula sa University of the Philippines (UP) na nagmula sa kaparehong insidente rin ng pananapak niya sa Maroon Recruit na si Mark Belmonte.

Samakatuwid, nasangkot na si Amores sa iba pang gulo sa mga basketball tournament niya ngayong taon. Kung bibilangin, ito na ang ikatlong pagkakataong nagdulot siya ng ganitong gulo. Hindi na natutuwa ang asosasyon (NCAA Management Committee), at nais na nilang wakasan ang pag-aamok nitong si Amores, kaya't binigyan nila ng sanction ang nasabing manlalaro.

Mula sa suspension ay nahantong ito sa expulsion mula sa kaniyang inirepresentang paaralan, ang JRU.

Ayon naman sa JRU, "After a thorough evaluation, the board is convinced that additional sanctions should be imposed upon [Amores] as part of internal processes on discipline observed by the school."

Naghanda na rin ang JRU ng mental health program para kay Amores at sa iba pang manlalaro ng JRU na naglalayong mapabuti ang pagharap sa iba't ibang problema ng mga estudyanteng manlalaro nito sa larong pampalakasan, sa akademiya, at maging na rin sa pansarili nilang mga buhay. Kabilang sa parusa ni Amores ang community service na magsisilbing leksiyon sa kaniyang aksiyon sa nakaraan nitong mga laro na dala ang pangalan ng JRU.

Dagdag pa niya, "I'm really sorry for what I've done, and I hope I get to change myself, and show you who I really am as a changed man."

Ayon sa pahayag ni Amores, "I apologized and asked for forgiveness for what I've done, to the fans, Benilde's fans, the JRU community, the NCAA community and its Mancom (Management Committee)."



"EXTRA EXPENSION PISO, PINOY



ow much is a cup of extra rice? How much is a bottle of water in the mall? How much is a full tank of gas? How much is a trip to the market worth?

Though different prices may come to mind for those questions, one answer remains common among the cries of ordinary Filipinos: "Mas mahal na kaysa dati." With the prevalence of such complaints among citizens, it is important to investigate the root of the drastic increase in prices in the Philippines.

In doing so, we can see that the price increase can be attributed to a single major issue: the weak peso value. Due to this situation, commodities become more expensive for the average Filipino, proving to be alarming for all.



"The Peso is Weak Because the Dollar is Strong"

It is crucial to first briefly address the elephant in the room regarding the peso value topic, which is Ilocos 1st District Representative Sandro Marcos' infamous interview quote that drew flak across social media: "The peso is not weak because the peso is weak. The peso is weak because the dollar is strong."

Despite Sandro's perplexing wording, his statement is correct to some extent, given the global value of the United States (U.S.) dollar. The dollar is arguably the most powerful currency in the world, with the developed country U.S. receiving substantial investments that led them to be the global standard for money value.

Therefore, when we compare one dollar equating to 56.70 pesos, the value of our money appears weak.

However, it is important to be aware of the background behind this. Investors choose to invest more in the U.S. since they see the chaotic Philippine climate as a risk, given our government's evident inability to respond to internal crises.

Thus, Sandro's controversial statement could be better worded into the following: "The peso is weak because the Philippines is weak compared to other countries." We must first improve the state of local and national issues to stabilize our country and make it less of a business risk. We must first fix our internal affairs before we can earn greater respect in external markets.


Weak Peso Value = "Ang Mahal Naman" Mentality

With that background now addressed, the main issue now arises, which is the practical implication of this peso value issue. Though it may seem daunting for some at first glance, the peso value is not just an issue for economic academics or businesspeople. In layman's terms, the weak peso value basically translates to the expensiveness problem with commodities in the country – an extremely noticeable and alarming phenomenon.

To illustrate, just one glance around when you go out sums up this issue. There are sudden parking fees everywhere now. There are expensive service charges everywhere now. Everywhere you go, it seems that everything continues to become more costly.

Thus, when Filipinos voice out how expensive-seeming goods are nowadays, they must also be aware that it may be one of the inevitable consequences of the weakened peso value. This problem affects us all, so it is essential that Filipinos understand the news around this matter.

The Filipino Value

With all of that, it can be said that the value of the peso reflects our value as Filipinos. If our currency cannot keep up with conversion rates, this shows that our country is falling behind compared to the rest of the world. We have become more dependent on imports, to the point that it becomes at the expense of our exports. We struggle to sustain ourselves as an independent country, with our local businesses scrambling and lacking support.

If we want to rise from this dismaying state of the Philippine economy, the government must draw more focus on improving local producers to be able to improve our exportation.

There is a long way to go in terms of being more competitive in the global market, and this winding path to move forward from the weak peso value is vital if we are to improve the Philippines' value in the global scheme.


Not Enough for Extra Rice

Going back to the initial question: how much is a cup of extra rice, then? Is it roughly 40 pesos in fast food chains? Is it almost a hundred pesos in other restaurants? How much more will it be? How much more will we have to adjust?

With the rate of product price increase in the Philippines nowadays, basic expenses will continue to become more dismaying for Filipinos. If the government does not improve the local business scheme and lessen imports to appease the weakening peso value situation, our value as a country will not be able to keep up with the rest of the world, making the future of Filipinos bleak.


So, no: The "Ang mahal na ng extra rice" problem is not just a casual complaint. It is only one of the simple yet impactful reflections on how goods in the Philippines continue to become extra expensive – until average Filipinos' wallets will no longer have any extra left for themselves.




CERBO, CASTILLO, AND CAPITLE COP GOLD AS JĪNS ACE NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS

MAX VERSTAPPEN IS CROWNED WORLD CHAMPION IN JAPAN BYDIEGO JOSUE

Last October 9, 2022, Max Verstappen of Oracle Red Bull Racing clinched his 2nd World Drivers' Championship at the Japanese Grand Prix held at the Suzuka International Racing Course in Suzuka, Japan. After his season-long battle with Lewis Hamilton of Mercedes in last year's F1 world championship, fans have put his first title win under a microscope, stating it to be a championship that was handed to him. While this couldn't be any further from the truth, Max Verstappen has certainly silenced the doubters by capping off the 2022 world championship with a dominant victory.

Max secured pole position during qualifying, beating out Charles Leclerc of Ferrari by only one-hundredth of a second (0.010). This put him in the best position to win the race that Sunday if everything went to plan. However, the race on Sunday was anything but smooth sailing. From the start of the race, chaos ensued immediately as drivers were forced to start under treacherous conditions due to the heavy rainfall pouring on the racetrack. Because of this, drivers had little to no visibility as they dueled with their competitors. This resulted in multiple first-lap accidents, with one major incident of note being that of Carlos Sainz, the teammate of Charles Leclerc, who needed to stay in the race for Ferrari to keep their title hopes alive.

Following the string of accidents that occurred on the first lap, the race officials temporarily suspended the race due to safety concerns and waited for the rain to pass. After two hours, while the rain has not stopped, the conditions were certainly better compared to when the race began. Therefore, the race officials gave the green light and the race once again resumed. However, there was a catch: the race would not be fully completed due to time constraints. With that in mind, the race officials allotted the

race to only last for 40 minutes. In those 40 minutes, whoever would cross the finish line first would be declared the winner.

The race itself was very entertaining. While it only consisted of a few overtakes, these overtakes were a result of "multiple battles all over the racetrack that lasted for multiple laps on end.

The fate of the championship relied solely on the battle for second between Sergio Perez who was Max Verstappen's teammate, and Charles Leclerc who was Max's title rival and the only Ferrari driver left in the race. During the final lap of the race, Leclerc made a high-risk overtake on Perez for second place in the last few corners of the racetrack. However, in doing so, Leclerc went off-track and re-entered the circuit in a dangerous manner. Furthermore, when he re-entered the racetrack, he ended up ahead of Perez, which was considered an unfair overtake. Therefore, the race officials penalized Leclerc, which dropped him back to 3rd place. It is because of this mistake that Leclerc lost 10 points to Verstappen in this race, ultimately giving the title to the latter.




